

Rock Wrapping

inspired by artist Laurie Lambrecht

ABOUT THE ARTIST:

Laurie Lambrecht is inspired by textures, colors and patterns she finds in nature. She incorporates fabric, yarn & sewing, and photography into her artworks inspired by places.

MATERIALS:

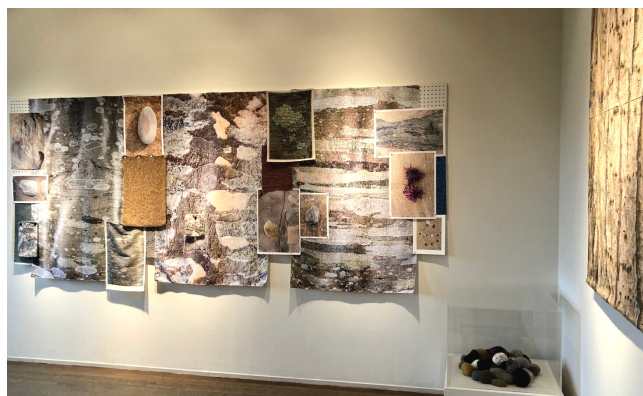
rocks, glue, different colors of yarn

You can also try:

- Using fabric loops (such as the ones used to make potholders) to wrap around the rocks without using scissors or glue.
- Take a photo of your wrapped rocks installation.

STEPS:

- ☐ 1. Gather a collection of rocks. They should be at least as big as the palm of your hand, the bigger they are the easier to wrap. Try to have at least 5 to group together.
- ☐ 2. Decide what yarn color combinations you'll want to create for each wrapped rock. Cut pieces of yarn long enough to wrap around the rock multiple times.
- ☐ 3. Hold the rock in one hand, then place a line of glue on the underside. Place one piece of yarn in the glue, hold in place, then tightly wrap the yarn around the rock. Play with patterns of different colors wrapped around, or try incorporating beads or braids.
- ☐ 4. Arrange your rocks in a grouping, or installation. Try out different arrangements!
